Marjorie "Marge" M. Schmutzler, 96, of Kingsford, passed away Friday, November 20, 2020, at Evergreen Assisted Living in Kingsford.

Marjorie was born October 3, 1924 in Iron Mountain to the late Paul and Ruth (Whitenack) Sitka. She graduated from Channing High School in 1942 and went on to earn her B.S. degree in education from Illinois College where she met her future husband, Dr. Walter Schmutzler, during her freshman year. They were married and resided in the Iron Mountain area where Dr. Schmutzler practiced family medicine, and Marjorie stayed home and raised their two children. Dr. Schmutzler preceded her in death in 1977.

Marjorie was a member of the IM-K Women's Club, the Community Chorus, the Chippewa Club, DCH Hospital League and the First Presbyterian Church Choir. In her free time she enjoyed quilting, cross-stitching, playing the piano, and gardening, especially her dahlias and gladiolas. She was also an avid Green Bay Packer fan, a stockholder and season ticket holder since 1958. She attended the Ice Bowl game and continued attending home Packer games well into her 80's.
