Mary Miller Johnson, 83, of Florence, WI, passed away Tuesday, March 23, 2021, at her home.

Mary was born May 28, 1937 in Ann Arbor, MI, daughter of Dr. Norman and Dorothy (Kingsford) Miller. She graduated from Ann Arbor High School and afterwards attended Florida Southern University and University of Michigan. In 1958 she married Michael Groves, who preceded her in death in 1963, and on June 27, 1973, she married Lindley Johnson in Ann Arbor.

Mary worked as a flight attendant for TWA, an executive assistant at John Gard Development, and a medical case manager for 17 years before retiring at the age of 80.
