NIAGARA, Wis. - Richard "Dinger" Recla, 77, of Mesa, Ariz., formerly of Niagara, died Monday, Nov. 28, 2005, at the Veterans Administration Medical Center in Iron Mountain after a yearlong battle with cancer.

He was born June 19, 1928, in Norway, son of the late Basil and Anna (Vecellio) Recla. Dinger graduated from Niagara High School in 1946 and resided in the area for most of his life. He served in the United States Navy from 1946 to 1948.

Dinger married Faye Perry in August 1950 at St. Francis Xavier Catholic Church in Powers. She preceded him in death on March 28, 1994.

Dinger was employed at the Niagara Paper Mill for 42 years, retiring in 1992. He also was an agent for American Family Insurance Co. for more than 30 years. Shortly after retiring, Dinger moved to Mesa, where he resided for the last 10 years.

He was a member of the American Legion and Holy Cross Catholic Church in Mesa.

Dinger was a longtime member and past president of the Niagara Lions Club, where he was instrumental in forming several programs including the annual picnic. He enjoyed helping people, spending time with his family and recording and listening to music. Dinger loved traveling and his time spent in Arizona.

He is survived by two sons, Kim (Debbie) Recla of Iron Mountain and Dean (Renee) Recla of Niagara; a sister, Virginia Grenier of Norway; five grandchildren, Brent (Nicole), Robbie, Adam, Johnathan and Jennifer; and four great-grandchildren.

In addition to his wife and parents, Dinger was preceded in death by one brother, Leonard. A memorial Mass will be held at 11 a.m. on Friday at St. Anthony Catholic Church in Niagara. Fr. Michael Betley will officiate.

Interment will be in Norway Township Cemetery.

In lieu of flowers, a memorial will be established in his memory.
