

## Terrance K. Lindholm

January 31, 1941 - May 6, 2020

Terrance K. "Terry" Lindholm, also known as The Jolly Green Giant or Mr. Green Jeans, 79, of Kingsford, passed away Wednesday, May 6, 2020, at the Oscar G. Johnson VA Medical Center in Iron Mountain.

Terry was born January 31, 1941, in Norway, MI, son of the late John and Ada (Hammill) Lindholm. As an 8 year old child, Terry took the opportunity to show off the survival skills taught to him by his father by surviving a night in the woods alone, even making himself a bed of leaves to keep warm. He graduated from Iron Mountain High School in 1959 and enlisted in the United States Marine Corps where he served four years as a small weapons mechanic. On July 18, 1970, he married Constance "Koni" Chiochios in Watersmeet. Terry, a conservation officer, worked out of the Baraga DNR office. During his 25 year career, one of his highlights was being an integral part of the 1985 Moose/Wild Turkey exchange with Canada. At the time of his retirement in 1993, Terry was one of the highest ranked officers in Upper Michigan. In 1997, he and Koni moved to the family farmstead in Iron Mountain. He was a member of Trinity United Methodist Church in Iron Mountain, the American Legion Post 417 of Watersmeet, the Masonic Lodge of Ewen/Trout Creek, Whitetails Unlimited of Ontonagon County where he was inducted into the Hall of Fame, and a life member of the North American Hunting Club. He was also a member of the Iron Mountain Parkinson's Support Group, bragging that he was the most decorated member, as he had been invited to partner with the Michael J. Fox Foundation. This collaboration resulted in today's successful version of the Deep Brain Stimulation (DBS) surgery. He was an avid outdoorsman and enjoyed hunting and fishing. He also enjoyed trips to the casino and wintering with his wife, Koni, in Bull Shoals, Arkansas for 16 years. Most of all, Terry loved spending time at camp, teaching his grandchildren how to cheat at cards.

Terrance is survived by his wife of 49 years, Koni; children, Alan (Cathy) Lindholm of Gladstone, MI, and Crissy (Todd) Sain of Frisco, TX; a brother, Darrell Lindholm of Iron

Mountain, MI; a brother-in-law Rick Chiochios of Watersmeet, MI, grandchildren, Katie Lindholm, Seth Sain, Zachary (Samantha) Grenier, Zachary Sain, Jonathan Lindholm and a great grandchild on the way and several nephews and cousins and partner in crime, Dwayne Hosking.

In addition to his parents, Terry was also preceded in death by his father and mother-inlaw, Samuel and Fern Chiochios and a nephew, Blake Chiochios.

Visitation will be held from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon on Wednesday, July 22, 2020 at the Erickson-Rochon & Nash Funeral Home in Iron Mountain. A memorial service will follow at 12 noon at the funeral home. Rev. Geri Hamlen will officiate. Burial will be in Iron Mountain Cemetery Park.

The Uren-Cooper-Johnson American Legion Post #50 will conduct military graveside honors.
