Al "Ritchie" Ziehm, 78, of 901 West Sagola Avenue in Kingsford, died peacefully at his home on Wednesday, July 18, 2012.

Al was born March 20, 1934 in Crystal Falls, moving to Iron Mountain at an early age. He was a graduate of Iron Mountain High School.

He married the former Gaylyn Tirschel Loar on June 27, 1970 at Trinity United Methodist Church, and the couple recently celebrated their 42nd wedding anniversary.

Al proudly served in the U.S. Army in Trieste, Italy, during the Korean conflict. Upon his return stateside, he worked for several years in Chicago at the Ford Motor Company, Automatic Electric, and Koffman Tool & Engineering, becoming a proficient tool and die maker, before joining the Chicago Police Department in 1961.

He returned to the Iron Mountain-Kingsford area with his family in 1966, working first at Eagle Tool and then for the U.S. Postal Service. He spent 27 years with the U.S.P.S., retiring in 1992 as Postmaster of Athelstane, WI.

Al enjoyed playing pinochle, ice fishing, and spending time at his hunting camp with his dogs. He was also an avid bowler and golfer. He was a member of Oak Crest Golf Club.

He was preceded in death by a daughter, Kelly Loar; his mother, Elvirra Ziehm; his brothers, Marvin, Eugene, and Lyle Ziehm; his mother- and father – in- law, Faye and James Tirschel; his brother-in-law Michael Tirschel; and two

sisters-in-law, Peggy and Elaine Ziehm.

Al is survived by his beloved wife, Gaylyn; his daughter, Carla (George) Anderson of Kingsford; his three sons, Richard (Anne) Ziehm of Bellevue, Nebraska; Darryl Ziehm of Appleton, Wisconsin; and Kyle (Amy) Ziehm of Iron Mountain; ten grandchildren, and seven great-grandchildren; a sister, Lois Machus of Kingsford; a sister-in-law, Florence Ziehm of Highland, Indiana; many nieces and nephews, including Judy and Bert Potat of St. John, Indiana and Debbie and Dave McGuire of Williamston, Michigan.

Al always had a smile on his face and a funny story to tell. He could build or fix almost anything and was always eager to be of help to his friends and neighbors. He will be sadly missed and lovingly remembered by his family and his many friends.
