Albert W. "Al" Heidenreich, 80, of Iron Mountain, passed away on Thursday, July 28, 2011, at the Oscar G. Johnson V.A. Medical Center.

Al was born Dec. 15, 1930, in Iron Mountain, son of the late Felix and Elsie (Peters) Heidenreich.

He graduated from Kingsford High School in 1948 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy, serving until 1952.

Al married Carol Bennett on July 25, 1953, in Iron Mountain. He was employed with the Chicago and Northwest Railroad as a locomotive engineer for 38 years, retiring in 1987.

He was a member of the American Legion Post 50 of Iron Mountain. Al served on various committees and was involved in many aspects pertaining to the interests of Upper Peninsula sportsmen.

He was a member of U.P. Whitetails Assoc., the Sagola Sportsmen's Club, the United Sportsmen's Club, the U.P. Sportsmen's Alliance, the Sportsmen's Offroad Vehicle Assoc., the Eastern Dickinson Co. Sportsmen's Club, U.P. Trappers, District 3 Walleye Club, and Trail U.P.

Al also served on the Government Hunting & Fishing Task Force for four years.

He enjoyed hunting, fishing, trapping, woodworking, and most of all spending time around the kitchen table with his family and friends.

Al is survived by his wife of 58 years, Carol; a son Fritz M. (Amy) Heidenreich of Green Bay, Wis.; two daughters, Kathy (Ken) Clawson of Iron Mountain and Cindy Suplinski of Green Bay; six grandchildren, Teona (Eric) Miller, Tom, Erin, and Hana Heidenreich, Sara Clawson and Clayton Suplinski; and six great grandchildren; three step-grandchildren, Ken (Nachowin) Clawson, Eric (Jackie) Clawson, Cassandra (Ryan Clark) Clawson.
