SPREAD EAGLE, Wis. - Albert E. "Bud" Neitzel, 81, of Spread Eagle, died on Monday, Oct. 26, 2009, at the Golden Living Center in Florence, Wis.

He was born on Sept. 10, 1928, son of the late Albert E. and Evelyn (Vallier) Neitzel. He enlisted in the United States Army and was a veteran of the Korean War.

He attended the University of Wisconsin-Madison where he was a faithful and active member of the Delta Sigma Pi Fraternity. He would receive his bachelor of science degree in engineering, and go on to own and operate Converting Systems Inc. for many years before retiring.

Bud married Susan Fox on Sept. 20, 1958, in Iron Mountain at the Methodist Church.

Upon retiring, Bud became a Class A Master Club Maker, and started his own business making clubs in Kingsford, called Classic Clubs. While in Wisconsin, he was an active member in the United Methodist Church. Through the years he was very active in the church choir, and even sang with the Milwaukee Choristers, and other professional groups. He was a former member of the local American Legion Post 50.

Bud is survived by his wife of 51 years, Susan of Spread Eagle; children, Wade (Karyn) Neitzel of Madison, Wis., Dorothy Snebold of Onalaska, Wis., Amy (Jeff) Klemp of Franklin, Wis., and Janis (Mike) Parkinson of Verona, Wis.; seven grandchildren, Shanna, Matt, Sarah, Abby, Anthony, Corey, and Nicole; a brother, James (Rosie) Neitzel of Brookfield, Wis.; a sister-in-law, Jane Neitzel of Maine; and nieces, nephews, and cousins.

He was preceded in death by a grandson, Nathaniel and a brother, Bob Neitzel.

Visitation will be Saturday, Nov. 28, from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. at the Erickson-Rochon & Nash Funeral Home in Iron Mountain.

The funeral service will follow at 11 a.m. at the funeral home. Rev. Michael March will officiate.
