Alice J. Weaver, 89, of Iron Mountain, died Sat. January 14, 2012 at Freeman Nursing and Rehabilitation Community. She was born on April 29, 1922 in Munising, MI, the daughter of the late Frank C. and Anna J. (Blom) Logan.

She graduated from Iron Mountain High School in 1940. She married Clayton G. Weaver in June 8, 1946 in Kenosha, WI. He preceded her in death in 1985. “ During her 89 years, my mother touched our lives with her engaging curiosity and love of laughter.

Always a curious and avid reader, Alice had a lifelong interest in history and remembered many events from her childhood and youth, including the day that Thomas Edison died, when, as an awestruck nine year old, she stood outside with her parents and watched all of the street lights in Iron Mountain turned off in Edison's honor. Alice continued this interest in history during her adult years through her research about the Cornish Pump and mines in the area, including the "25 Location" where she grew up, which she shared with the Menominee Range Historical Museum.

Alice loved a good time with friends and family. For over 25 years, she played bridge once a month during the winter with Geraldine "Geri" Senatori, Mildred "Mid" Sparpana, and Adelaide "Skippy" Sandercock, her best friend for over 80 years. Alice loved to travel and eventually visited all of the states except Hawaii. She enjoyed fishing and sightseeing with my father, Clayton, until his death in 1985. Afterward, she took short trips in the UP with her brother Arnold Logan and longer trips with her other brother, George Logan, and his wife Gerry. For a number of years, until his death, she took trips with her special friend Arnie Paque. Over the last 20 years, she traveled to Texas, Virginia, and other states with her longtime companion Dick Barr. In each of the last five years, Alice made an annual sightseeing trip in August with her niece Nancy Henley, her 'adopted' niece Caren Erickson, and me.
