Annette Rose Thayer, 82, of Kingsford was received into eternal life on Tuesday, Dec. 17, 2019, surrounded by her family after a courageous battle with multiple illnesses.

Annette was born on Sept. 5, 1937 in Redfield, SD. She was the daughter of the late Ernest and Rose (Lutter) Richmond. Annette married George (Don) Thayer on May 30, 1954. He was stationed at Ellsworth AFB in Rapid City, SD where Annette was a carhop for the local A & W drive-in restaurant. Upon his discharge, the couple moved to Kingsford, MI. They spent 63 years together in marriage before Don preceded her in death.

Annette and Don were active members of the community. They taught square dancing and Annette sewed beautiful matching outfits for them to wear while dancing. They were also involved in the UP Antique Car Club and displayed their restored autos at many car shows in the surrounding states. They were long time members of the First United Presbyterian Church where Annette taught Sunday school for many years. They loved to play cards regularly with the gang. Annette also loved to garden, growing both beautiful flowers and vegetables that she canned for their family. Annette led aqua exercise classes at the community pool.

A cherished memory of the grandchildren is the day Gramps drag-raced a

motorcycle after driving Grandma's red convertible in a local parade. Gramps got off the line first but was passed by the bike. However, the biker lost when their pizzas were taken by the wind and Gramps, with his carload of grandkids, had to dodge the pieces, while the kids shrieked with laughter.

Annette is survived by three daughters, Debra (Ray) Bartnikowski of Iron Mountain, Donnette (Fred) Salczenko of Homestead and Denise Thayer of Quinnesec; six grandchildren, Lisa (Paul) Thoune, Michael (Sara) Salczenko, Christie Fleming, Raymond Bartnikowski, Jennifer (Ben Nevel) Bartnikowski and Nicole Grinnell; and many great-grandchildren. She is also survived by her brother, Richard (Lilliane) Richmond of Junction City, KS and numerous nieces and nephews.
