FOSTER CITY - Arlene C. Munroe, 77, of W2422 Cemetery Road in Foster City, died Sunday, March 8, 2009 at St. Vincent Hospital in Green Bay, Wis.

Arlene was born July 6, 1931, in Valley City, N.D., daughter of the late Al and Genevieve (Kramer) Kammerer. She was a lifelong resident of the area and was involved in the community.

Arlene drove school bus for the North Dickinson County School for 26 years, retiring in 1993. She was an active member of St. Joseph Catholic Church in Foster City. She also enjoyed watching birds, traveling and spending time with family, especially her grandchildren and great-grandchildren.
