



Barrett McGregor

August 29, 1939 - August 4, 2010

Barrett Clark McGregor, age 70 of Spread Eagle, WI and Surprise, AZ, formerly of Lake Forest, IL passed away Wednesday, August 4, 2010 after a courageous battle with Parkinson's Disease.

He was born August 29, 1939 in Iron Mountain, MI. He graduated from Kingsford High School in 1957 and University of Michigan in 1961 (BA) and 1963 (MBA). In the fall of 1963 Barrett enlisted in the Army Reserves and was honorably discharged in the fall of 1970. Barrett married Marcia Anderson on October 17, 1964 at North Park Covenant Church in Chicago, IL. He began his career as an investment banker at Chapman, Howe, Barnes and Co. in Chicago and later at William Blair and Co., becoming a general partner in 1973. After retirement in 1990 he later joined Renberg and Assoc., in Beverly Hills, CA. He served as a member of the board of directors of First National Bank of Norway, MI from 1987 to his passing.

He leaves his wife of 45 years, Marcia; and his children, Laura (David) Hansen of Stevens Point, WI, Jennifer McGregor of Lake Forest, IL and Anderson (Holly) McGregor of Chicago, IL. He was loved by his six grandchildren, Jana and Tyler Hansen, Graham , Chase and Harper Breidenbach and Tekla McGregor. He was preceded in death by his parents, Clark and Mildred (Barrett) McGregor.
