Beverly E. Davidson, 88, of Kingsford, died Friday, September 14, 2012, at Freeman's Nursing and Rehabilitation Community in Kingsford.

She was born July 12, 1924 in Iron Mountain, daughter of the late Chester and Gunhild (Broumlin) Cambray.
