Bruce Dale Wixtrom, 76, of Witch Lake, passed away on Saturday, Sept. 24, 2011, at his home after a lengthy illness.

He was born on Dec. 1, 1934, in Witch Lake, son of the late Seth and Mae (Doan) Wixtrom. He was a lifelong resident of Witch Lake.

Bruce married Arleen Laskowski on Dec. 15, 1956, and spent nearly 55 wonderful years together. Bruce owned and operated his own construction and excavating company for many years. He loved to work, and was a true craftsman when it came to any kind of building, especially the many cottages he built in the Witch Lake area.

Bruce is survived by his loving wife, Arleen Wixtrom of Witch Lake; his children, Catherine (William) Stratton of Witch Lake, Gary (Amy) Wixtrom of Witch Lake, and Julia Wixtrom of Palatine, Ill.; grandchildren, Kelley (Jeremy) Stark and Elise Wixtrom; great-granddaughter, Dana Stark and baby Stark due in March 2012; sisters, Marcelle Houlmont of Marquette, Donna Erickson of Republic, and Nancy (Fred) Spanton of Republic; a brother, Bill (Luana) Wixtrom of Republic; a sister-in-law, Helen Wixtrom of Witch Lake; and many nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by a sister, June Laakso, and brothers, James and

Jack Wixtrom.

Visitation is set for Wednesday from 10 a.m. to 12 noon (Eastern time) at the First Baptist Church of Witch Lake.

The funeral service will follow Wednesday at 12 noon (Eastern time) at the church. Tim Spanton will officiate.
