ST. LOUIS, Mo. - Camille Patrick Frigo, 83, of St. Louis, formerly of Chicago, died Monday, May 16, 2005, at Town and Country Nursing Home in St. Louis. He was born on March 17, 1922, the son of the late Pasquale and Camilla (Rocheleau) Frigo.

He served in the U.S. Army during World War II, receiving the Purple Heart and Bronze Star.

Camille worked as a cheesemaker and a salesman for Frigo Cheese in Florence and Chicago. He was a devoted father and husband. He was a generous man who gave freely of his time and resources.

He married Veronica Smith on Nov. 29, 1951, in Eagle River, Wis. She preceded him in death on Sept. 22, 2003.
