IRON MOUNTAIN - Carl M. Seppi, 59, of Iron Mountain, died Wednesday morning, Dec. 7, 2005, at the VA Medical Center in Milwaukee.

He was a proud Marine, serving and being severely injured in Vietnam combat. After returning from Vietnam, he graduated from Northern Michigan University and worked as an executive for the Department of Defense until 1998. Carl then returned to the U.P. and started working on his dream retirement spot overlooking Lake Superior. He was never able to complete it because of the leukemia that took him much too soon. While he was clearing the land at his "Bear Harbor" he purchased and renovated a 100 year-old duplex on Iron Mountain's northside.

Carl is survived by his brother Vic (Joann) Seppi of Iron Mountain; his sister, Ruth (Lyle) Klemz of Lehr, N.D.; and numerous nieces and nephews
