Carol M. Negro, 91, of Iron Mountain, passed away on Thursday, May 22, 2014 at Dickinson County Memorial Hospital.

She was born December 25, 1922 in Iron Mountain, daughter of the late Michael and Elda (Rudolph) Fornetti. Carol graduated from Iron Mountain High School in 1941 and was a lifelong resident of the area. Following graduation she attended Dundon's Business College and then took a position with the Commercial National Bank where she remained employed until they started a family.
