KINGSFORD - Caroline "Tillie" Miller, 87, of Kingsford, passed away on Sunday, Jan. 25, 2009, at Dickinson County Memorial Hospital after a long and courageous battle with lung disease.

Tillie was born on Jan. 9, 1922, in Iron Mountain, daughter of Richard and Elizabeth (McLeod) Uren and was the youngest of their 11 children. She grew up in Iron Mountain and graduated in 1939 from Iron Mountain High School as salutatorian of her class.

Tillie married Walter H. Miller of Vulcan on Oct. 23, 1942, when Walter was serving his country in the U.S. Navy during World War II. In her youth, Tillie was employed for a time at Wisconsin-Michigan Power Co. During the first part of the war, Tillie worked as a reporter for the Iron Mountain News and was secretary to the editor. She moved to Milwaukee in 1944, to care for family.

After the war ended, Tillie and Walter moved to Houghton while Walter completed his college education at Michigan Technological University, graduating with an electrical engineering degree in 1949. They spent the rest of their lives in the Iron Mountain area. Their loving marriage lasted more than 55 years until Walter's passing in 1998.

Tillie was an accomplished soprano and remained active in the music and arts

community in the Iron Mountain area for her entire life. During and after the war years, she sang soprano with her cousin, Rugean Fraker and sisters, Dorothy Underhill and Jean LaHaie in the popular vocal group "The Uren Sisters" performing many times in the area. She was also active in "The Lions Roar" productions and operetta, singing the lead role in "The Merry Widow" in 1960. She sang in the choir at the First Presbyterian Church in Iron Mountain and Kingsford for many years, and was the soprano soloist in numerous productions of "The Messiah" by Handel. Her lovely voice was enjoyed by many. She was an active member of Matinee Musicale, the Music Club and the PEO for many years. She was also a member of the Order of the Eastern Star.

Tillie is survived by her sons, Dr. Robert W. Miller of Allentown, Pa. and Rodney T. (Lynn) Miller M.D. of Dallas; her grandchildren, William Miller, Amanda List, Derek Miller and Allyson Miller; her great-grandchildren, Thomas List, Stephanie List and Devin Miller and numerous nieces and nephews.

Tillie was preceded in death by her husband Walter, her son; William; brothers, Richard and Howard Uren; and sisters, Ruth Uren, Inez Keen, Elizabeth Zahn, Violet Gambucci, Dorothy Underhill and Jean LaHaie.

Visitation will be Friday from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the Erickson-Rochon & Nash Funeral Home.

Funeral services will be Saturday at 11 a.m. at First Presbyterian Church. Rev. Michael March will officiate.

Burial will be in Cemetery Park.

In lieu of flowers, a memorial will be established in her memory at the First

Presbyterian Church in Kingsford.
