EAST KINGSFORD - Cecile Ott, 89, of East Kingsford, formerly of Randville, went to be with her Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ on Friday, Dec. 5, 2008, at Dickinson County Memorial Hospital.

She was born on April 24, 1919, in Withful, W.Va., the daughter of the late Madison and Sarah (Crigger) Sexton.

Cecile married John Ott on Nov. 10, 1936, in Randville. He preceded her in death on Dec. 29, 1997.

Cecile was a longtime resident of Randville, where she was a caregiver to many. She helped her Randville neighbors as a nurse, banker, and taxi. She worked as a cook at Lake Ellen Bible Camp for 30 years.

Family was very important to Cecile. She loved and was deeply devoted to her family. She enjoyed being a hostess, always having on a fresh pot of coffee and making sure no one left her home hungry. Cecile was also a wonderful homemaker, who liked cooking, canning, and making crafts. She also was very sharp at putting together jigsaw puzzles.
