



## Clementine Mariucci

May 8, 1923 - November 30, 2010

Clementine "Clem" Mariucci, 87, of Florence, formerly of Iron Mountain, passed away on Tuesday, Nov. 30, 2010, at the Golden Living Center in Florence.

She was born on May 8, 1923, in Iron Mountain, daughter of the late Solly and Glendora (Rodda) Stamper. She was a lifelong resident of Iron Mountain.

She married Albert "Cabbie" Mariucci on Sept. 6, 1947, at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church. Cabbie preceded her in death on March 16, 1986.

Clem held several jobs throughout her life including credit and collection positions at the Iron Mountain Credit Bureau, Montgomery Ward, and Sears Roebuck. She was employed as a secretary at Catholic Social Services for more than 28 years before retiring in 1993. In addition, Clem and Cabbie owned the Four Lane Bar in Iron Mountain. She was a member of the Lady Elks and had bowled for the Dickinson Hotel team in her early years.

She loved playing bingo with her friends, trips to the casino, shopping, baking Christmas cookies, any Italian food, and traveling to Las Vegas with her daughter. She was a skilled cribbage and canasta player. She loved to watch baseball and cheered for the Atlanta Braves and anyone playing the Cubs. Clem was devoted to her dogs through the years and those belonging to her

daughter and son-in-law. She was a loving dog and cat "grammie" who spoiled the pets every chance she could.

Clem is survived by her daughter and best friend, Trudi (Karl) Seaholm of Florence; brothers-in-law, Ernest Mariucci of Iron Mountain, Ardo (Alma) Mariucci of De Pere, Wis., and Eugene Farrington of Iron Mountain; sister-in-law, Genevieve Mariucci of Florence; and many nieces and nephews.

Visitation will be Friday from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. at the Erickson-Rochon & Nash Funeral Home in Iron Mountain.

The funeral service will follow at 6 p.m. at the funeral home. Pastor Doug Johnson will officiate.
