IRON MOUNTAIN - Daniel W. Dyer, 45, of W8079 South U.S. 2 in Iron Mountain, died, Wednesday, Dec. 21, 2005, at his home with his wife by his side, after a short illness. In the final days of his battle with skin cancer, Dan concentrated on living with a quality of life.

Dan served in the United States Navy aboard the USS Trippe (FF1075) and the Jesse L. Brown (FF1089).

For many years, he was the night auditor at the AmericInn of Norway where he met and helped many wonderful people. He also worked at Roper Hospital in Charleston, S.C. for 19 years as a boiler operator and maintenance mechanic. Dan received many awards and recognition, including an article in Life magazine for his part in keeping Roper Hospital operational during Hurricane Hugo.

Dan's hobbies were computers, fishing and in later years, hunting. He was not a church going person, although he believed and often spoke privately with God.

He is survived by his wife and soulmate, Denise; his mother, Marilyn Dyer of Iron Mountain; a brother, David Dyer of Iron Mountain; an aunt, Patricia Dyer-Bond of Clearwater, Fla.; and a cousin, Lori Bond of Clearwater.

He was preceded in death by his father, Drew J. Dyer.

Cremation will take place and private services are being held.

Because Dan was an animal lover, he would appreciate memorials made in

his memory to the Springlake Humane Society in lieu of flowers.
