Darell W. Pugh, 70, of Kingsford, went to be with the Lord on Friday, April 29, 2011, with his family by his side, after a short but courageous battle with cancer.

Darell was born April 20, 1941 in Iron Mountain and graduated from Kingsford High School in 1959. He enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1960 where he served as a paratrooper with the 101st airborne. In 1964, Darell married the former Joanne St. Arnauld. He worked for Breitung Township Schools for 28½ years as a bus driver /custodian, retiring in 1999. Darell enjoyed life and the outdoors, especially being at camp with family and friends. He loved riding the 4-wheelers with his children and grandchildren. He had a passion for bird hunting, deer hunting and spent a few years raising pheasants with his son, Mark. Darell was an avid trap and skeet shooter at both the United Sportsmen's Club and the Dunbar Sportsmen's Club. He was recognized by many because of his distinctive laugh and people knew him by his laugh even if they didn't actually see him.

Darell is survived by his wife of 46 years, Joanne, and their two children, Michelle Galindo and Mark (Cheryl) Pugh. He was known and adored as "Papa" to six grandchildren, Logan Galindo, Morgan Galindo, Brittany Pugh, Marissa Cevigney, Rachel Cevigney, Sawyer Pugh and one great grandchild, Ayden Galindo. He is also survived by his mother, Mary Hyland Massicotte; a

brother, Donald “Dick” (Sally) Pugh; a sister, Linda (George) Bender; brother-in-law, Ed (Pam) St. Arnauld; sister-in-law, Joanne (Pugh) Helgren; and many nieces, nephews, cousins, aunts and uncles.

He was preceded in death by his father, Kenneth Pugh; step-mother, Martha Pugh; a brother, Ken Pugh; and his mother-in-law & father-in-law, Eva and Alden St. Arnauld.
