PRENTICE, Wis. - Dean E. Gislason, 53, of Prentice, formerly of Iron Mountain, died unexpectedly on Saturday, May 15, 2004, at the Sacred Heart Hospital in Tomahawk, Wis.

He was born on Nov. 2, 1950, in Oak Park, Ill., the son of Jean (Holroyd) Gislason and the late Neal Gislason. Dean resided in Iron Mountain from 1985 until 1991.

He had owned and operated Service Master here and in Dillon, Colo. from 1978 until 1999. He had also been employed at Slumberland Furniture in Wausau, Wis. At the time of his death, he was employed at the Chalet in Tomahawk.

Dean recently completed his nurse's aide certificate. He was known to be a friendly and personable guy and was a strong Christian man.

He is survived by four children; Erica Gislason of Burlington, Vt., Heide Gislason of Denver, Kyle Gislason of Prentice and Ben Gislason of Iron Mountain; his mother, Jean Gislason of Marion, Iowa; one grandson, Lief Gislason; two brothers, Gary (Jane) Gislason of Bemidji, Minn. and David Gislason of Ithaca, N.Y.; two sisters, Amy (Craig) Welt of Iowa City, Iowa and Jill Rogers of Ft. He was preceded in death by his father, Neal Gislason on March 16, 2003.
