



## Dennis Tachick

May 1, 1918 - May 1, 2013

Dennis L. Tachick, 95, of Powers, passed away on Wednesday, May 1, 2013 at Pinecrest Medical Care Facility in Powers, MI.

He was born February 23, 1918 in Pound, WI, son of the late John and Minnie (Dora) Tachick. Dennis grew up in Kingsford, Michigan and graduated from Kingsford High School in 1935. He retired after working more than 41 years in the rural electrification field. His work included 11 years in office and field positions with the Rural Electrification Administration and 30 years with the former Eastern Illinois Power Cooperative in Paxton, Illinois where he served as General Manager for 23 years. He and his late wife, Audrey, were active, long-time members in the Covenant Church, both in Paxton, Illinois and Iron Mountain, Michigan. Tachick was an avid fisherman and in retirement in Iron Mountain, could be found most days on the Peavy backwaters, fishing pole in hand.

He is survived by a son, Dennis, a daughter, Carol, 3 grandchildren, and 5 great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his wife, Audrey, and grandson, Christopher.
