IRON MOUNTAIN - Easter Anna Rampanelli, 91, formerly of 311 E. Smith St. in Iron Mountain, passed away Thursday, July 31, 2008, at Manor Care Health Services in Kingsford.

Easter was born April 8, 1917, in Crystal Falls, daughter of the late Albert and Mary (Steddick) Drake. She graduated from Crystal Falls High School.

Easter married Mario Rampanelli and he preceded her in death in 1990. Easter was a longtime member of Immaculate Conception Catholic Church. For the last 17 years, Easter worked at the St. Vincent de Paul store in Iron Mountain.

She is survived by a daughter, Suzanne (Dr. John) Bird of Northbrook, Ill.; two grandchildren, John Jr. (Deborah) Bird of Glenview, Ill. and Brian (Jean) Bird of Atlanta, Ga.; and six great-grandchildren, John III, Jacob, Emma, Brian Jr., Anna "Josie" and Roddey. Easter was preceded in death by two brothers, Joseph and Francis Drake and a sister, Eleanor West.

Burial will be in Cemetery Park.
