Iron Mountain lost a hero Uber driver named Ed on Thursday May 5, 2022. Edward Fay Olson II was born May 21st, 1969 at 17:35 military time at the Naval Hospital on the Island of Guam. Ed always saw himself as a hero and stopped to help anyone he saw in need. He wasn't afraid of anything nor anyone; and not afraid to speak his mind. Whether it was riding around in a full batman suit in his youth or driving his friend to work at 4am in the morning, he would give his life in an instant if he thought he could save someone. He was very proud to help prevent drunk driving as an Uber driver and to be able to drive people to any place at any time that no one else would. He was preceded in death by his father Edward Fay Olson and Starlan Jeanne Jones. Through tragedy he was raised by Doris Smith and grandparents Arthur and Ruth Dunkel. He is survived by his mom Doris, his daughter Ashley, fiancé Amy Rossier and her children Kyle and SkyLee, his siblings John Olson, Esther Kroeplin, Starlina Hines, Sara Booth, Sheila Annear, Charlynn Allen, Heather Lambert, and Adam Olson.
