KINGSFORD - Elizabeth "Betty" Cudnohufsky, 93, of Evergreen Heights Assisted Living Center, formerly of 728 E. Withworth in Kingsford, died, Sunday, May 25, 2008, at her home.

Betty was born on Sept. 9, 1914, in Norway, and was the daughter of the late John and Parmelia (Pariseau) Chamberlain. She was raised in this area and graduated from Niagara High School.

Betty married Adolph Cudnohufsky on Aug. 31, 1933, in Niagara and he preceded her in death in February 1998.

She was employed as part of the war effort during World War II with the General Motors Corp. in Pontiac, Mich. Following the war, she stayed with the company for more than 28 years, retiring from GM Truck and Coach in 1967. After her retirement, she and her husband returned to this area and have resided here since.

Betty was an active person and attended American Martyrs Church in Kingsford. She was also a volunteer at the Iron Mountain VA Medical Center for over 25 years. She enjoyed bingo, Polish poker, playing cards and was involved in several bowling and dart leagues over the years. Betty also enjoyed gardening.

She is survived by a brother, George Chamberlain of Auburn Heights, Mich.; her niece, Carol West of Orion, Mich. and many other nieces and nephews including special caregivers, Eugene Cudnohufsky, Aileen Lewis, Irene Ebidon, and Lloyd and Nancy Cudnohufsky.

In addition to her husband, she was preceded in death by five brothers, Harry, Andrew, Fred, Joseph and John Chamberlain and four sisters, Marie Dupruis, Albina Sartori, Margaret Bryner and Blanche Cudnohufsky.

Private services were held.

Burial will be in White Chapel Cemetery in Troy, Mich.
