Floyd D. Schultz, 88, of Kingsford, died Monday, March 9, 2015 at ManorCare Health Services. He was born on October 9, 1926 in Kingsford, the son of the late William and Ann (Tappy) Schultz.

Floyd graduated from Kingsford High School and had served in the US Army during World War II. He worked at the Niagara Paper Mill before starting Kingsford Broach and Tool with his brother Ray.
