Frank E. Lake, Jr., 53 of Kingsford, died Friday, June 9, 2017 at Dickinson County Memorial Hospital. He was born on Sept. 10, 1963, the son of Frank and Beverly (Arnold) Lake, Sr.

Frank graduated from Niagara High School in 1982, where he played tennis and was the starting quarterback for the football team. He went to college at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater. During his school years, he worked at the Gamble's Store in Niagara, the Niagara Paper Mill, and the Champion Paper Mill.

While selling concessions at the Norway Speedway, he met the love of his life, Lisa Campbell. The couple was united in marriage on Aug. 16, 1986 at St. Anthony Catholic Church in Niagara.

Frank as a senior programmer analyst for M.J. Electric, working there for over thirty years. Most importantly, Frank was a dedicated family man. He was devoted to his wife, Lisa, their children, and grandson. He was a loving son, brother, and uncle. Frank liked to do his best to make everyone smile, and liked a good joke. He had a kind heart and would help anyone in need. He was tireless and always working on a project.

Frank is survived by his wife Lisa, two children Franky Lake of Kingsford, and Lorissa (Cody) Klema of Marinette, one grandson Xander Lake of Kingsford, his mother Beverly Lake of Niagara, one brother Jerry Lake of Pewaukee, WI, four sisters Lisa (Kerry) Berdinner of Vulcan, Linda (Richard) Robinson of Waucesau, Sandra (Don) Powalka of Niagara, and Rose Scott of Kingsford, and two brothers-in-law Craig (Danielle) Campbell of Kingsford and David (Kari) Campbell of Neenah.
