George J. Brozovich, 89, of Iron Mountain, died Wed. Sept. 7, 2011 at Marquette General Hospital in Marquette. He was born on April 22, 1922 in Dodgeville, MI, the son of the late Thomas and Frances (Farragh) Brozovich.

George attended Kingsford Schools. He married Beatrice Barr on Oct. 17, 1942 in the parsonage of the Church of Christ in Kingsford. As a newlywed, George was inducted into the U.S. Army, on Dec. 8, 1942. He was assigned to the medical unit of the 82nd Airborne Division, serving in the European Theater. His company was commended for heroism and George received the Bronze Star for Heroic conduct in the Normandy Invasion. George was honorably discharged on Sept. 23, 1945. After his discharge from the service, he received his pilot's license.

George was a fireman and when Kingsford was chartered as a city, he became one of the city's first firemen. He retired after thirty years of service to Kingsford.

George enjoyed working crossword puzzles, trout fishing, and deer hunting. He and Beatrice enjoyed going to the Sagola and Homestead Senior Citizen Centers.

He is survived by his wife of almost 69 years, Beatrice, one daughter Karen

(Robert) Seelund of Felch, two granddaughters Ellen (Reggie) Nord of Hardwood and Angel Seelund of Kingsford, four great grandchildren Levi Bates, Robert Bates, Regina Nord, and Emma Nord, and many nieces and nephews.

George was preceded in death by three sisters Mary Mortl, Frances Johnson, and Ann Mary Valerio, and one brother John Brozovich.

At George's request, there will be no services. Burial will be in Cemetery Park.
