IRON MOUNTAIN - Gildo DeMuri, 87, of 508 E. Main St., Iron Mountain, died Thursday, May 11, 2006, at Dickinson County Memorial Hospital in Iron Mountain.

He was born August 20, 1918, in Iron Mountain, son of Italian immigrants Antonio and Angelina (Atocchi) DeMuri. Gildo graduated from Iron Mountain High School in 1936 and was a lifelong resident of the area.

He was a United States Army veteran of World War II, obtaining the rank of staff sergeant.

Gildo married Christine Frigo on June 23, 1956, in Florence, Wis. She preceded him in death on Jan. 6, 1991.

Gildo worked for Frigo Cheese, starting out as a warehouse worker. Upon returning from the war, he became an office manager and eventually moved into the position of assistant general manager and part-owner.

Gildo was a member of Immaculate Conception Catholic Church and the Uren-Cooper-Johnson American Legion Post 50. He enjoyed music, the outdoors, camping, canoeing and cross country skiing.
