Gregory Allen Bradley, 72, of Iron Mountain peacefully passed away on Friday, October 13, 2023, at Marshfield Medical Center-Dickinson in Iron Mountain, MI.

Greg was born August 3rd, 1951, to Barbara (Paiement) Kisor and Alexander Bradley in Mankato, MN. Greg grew up and lived his rambunctious young life in Farmington, MN. After graduating from Farmington High School in 1969, Greg enlisted in the Navy and served for 6 years, receiving the National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal, and First Good Conduct Award.
