



## Hal Crankshaw

July 25, 1950 - July 25, 2008

IRON MOUNTAIN - Hal F. Crankshaw, 58, of N 5330 Highway M-95, Iron Mountain, died Friday, July 25, 2008, at his home.

Hal was born Jan. 20, 1950, in Greenville, Mich., son of Frank and Verna (Crane) Crankshaw. He graduated from Greenville High School in 1968 and went on to become a master electrician. He was a Vietnam War veteran serving in the U.S. Army with the 82nd Division-101st Airborne.

Hal married his high school sweetheart, Mary Moon, on Feb. 1, 1969, in Greenville. For the last nine years, Hal was the Dickinson County Construction Code electrical inspector. He was a member of Grace Presbyterian Church in Sagola, Hermansville Vietnam Veterans of America, and the American Legion Post 0101 in Greenville.

Hal loved the Upper Peninsula and enjoyed hunting, fishing and the outdoors. He was a jack of all trades and could fix anything. Hal also enjoyed spending time with family, especially his grandchildren.

He is survived by his wife, Mary; his parents, Frank and Verna Crankshaw of Greenville; two daughters, Sara (Vince) Castillo of Clinton Township, Mich. and their children, Vinnie and Julien, and Carey (Brian) Elliott of Norway Township and their son, Race; his mother and step father-in-law, Irv and Mary

Lueder of Grand Rapids, Mich.; two brothers, John (Judy) Crankshaw of Grand Rapids and Donald Crankshaw of Evansville, Ind.; a sister, Phyllis (Brian) Moser of Greenville; brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law, Tom and Jan Moon and Arthur and Maxine (Moon) Kestner; sister-in-law, Brenda Moon, and several nieces and nephews.

Hal was preceded in death by a granddaughter, Elena Marie Castillo, a sister-in-law, Drella Crankshaw; and his father-in-law, Max L. Moon.

Visitation will be held from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. on Monday at Grace Presbyterian Church in Sagola.

A memorial service will follow at 11 a.m. at the church. Rev. David Anderson will officiate.

There will also be a memorial service on Aug. 2, 2008, at the Greenville American Legion Post 0101 in Greenville from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m.

In lieu of flowers, a memorial will be established to the Grace Presbyterian Church Building Fund in Hal's memory.
