IRON MOUNTAIN - Henry "Hank" L. Dulan, 85, of 910 West A St., Iron Mountain, died Tuesday, Oct. 16, 2007, at Dickinson County Memorial Hospital.

Hank was born July 13, 1922, in Iron Mountain, son of the late Leopold and Therese (Pocnoich) Dulan. He was a 1940 graduate of Iron Mountain High School and a U.S. Navy veteran of World War II.

Hank married the former Crystal Hanson on June 11, 1951, in Florence. He retired after many years as the rate clerk for Clairmont Transfer. Hank was member of First Covenant Church and served as an auditor for the church.
