AURORA, Wis. - Howard G. Anderson, 95, of Aurora, died Sunday, May 18, 2008, at the Golden Living Center in Florence.

He was born on Nov. 19, 1912, in Baileys Harbor, Wis., the son of the late John and Agnes (Rodberg) Anderson. He graduated from Iron Mountain High School. Howard worked for the E.A.
