KINGSFORD - James Edward Balmes, 77, of 516 Harding Ave., Kingsford, died Thursday, May 4, 2006, at Hyland Nursing Home in Iron Mountain.

He was born on Feb. 18, 1929, in Marquette, the son of the late William and Rae (Feeley) Balmes. He graduated from Bishop Baraga High School class of 1947. Jim was a member of the United States National Guard out of Ishpeming, and was a part of the medic unit.

He married Marjorie Ann Nelson on July 29, 1950, in Marquette at St. Peter Cathedral.

James attended dental courses, and was licensed by the National Board for Certification and referred to as a CDT (Certified Dental Technician) by the American Dental Association. While in Marquette, he worked at the Quinn Dental lab. He began his career at the VA as a dental technician on March 24, 1952. Jim founded the Balmes Dental Lab and worked with the VA Hospital in this position until his retirement on March 17, 1984.

He was a member of the St. Mary Queen of Peace Catholic Church in Kingsford. He enjoyed hunting and playing cards. He loved spending time with his grandchildren, and his dog, Harley Ann. Jim gave 25 years of volunteer

service to the VA Federal Credit Union.

Jim is survived by his wife, Marjorie; children, Nancy Ann (Mark) Bertrand of Howell, lower Michigan, Paul (Theresa) Balmes of Kingsford and David (Laurie) Balmes of Iron Mountain; four grandchildren, Michelle and Nicole Bertrand and Zachary and Kalli Balmes.

He was preceded in death by an infant granddaughter, Kristine Balmes.

A memorial service will be held at a later date.

Burial will be at Cemetery Park in Iron Mountain.
