July 2, 1933 - October 26, 2012

James A. "Jim" Merritt, 79, of Niagara, passed away on Friday, October 26, 2012 at Bellin Hospital in Green Bay with family at his side.

Jim was born July 2, 1933 in Oconto, WI, son of the late Floyd and Violet (Boes) Merritt. He graduated from Niagara High School and was a resident of the area for most of his life. Jim was a U.S. Marine Corp Veteran of the Korean War was awarded several decorations & citations for his service to our country which included the U.N. Service Medal, the Korean Service Medal with 3 stars, the National Defense Service Medal and a Purple Heart for being wounded in action. He was an extremely proud veteran who never left the house without his Marine Corp hat and jacket and lived by the words, "once a marine, always a marine". Jim married Jean M. Provencher on August 28, 1954 in Niagara, and they spent 58 wonderful years together. Jim was employed at the Niagara Paper Mill for almost 40 years, retiring in 1994. He was a member of St. Anthony Catholic Church in Niagara and in his early years was in the Knights of Columbus. Jim was an avid outdoorsman who enjoyed hunting, fishing and camping. He was also a big Wisconsin Badgers and Green Bay Packers fan. Jim had an appreciation for antiques and collectables and enjoyed frequenting rummage sales to see what he might find. He was a loving husband, father and grandfather and will be greatly missed by all.

Jim is survived by his wife, Jean; five children, Julie (Roger) Lantagne of Green Bay, Jeff (Cathy) Merritt of Sobieski, WI, Jay (Amy) Merritt of Quinnesec, Janice Merritt of Green Bay and Jodi (Reiny) Merritt-Klingeisen of Sobieski; seven grandchildren, Brad Lantagne of Los Angeles, CA, Christopher Wallace of Green Bay, Kendra Merritt of Green Bay, JoLee & Jonah Klingeisen of Sobieski, Briana Kemnitz of Niagara and Zach Kemnitz of Quinnesec; four great grandchildren, Evalyn, Alexis, & Chandler Wallace and Syhe Kemnitz; and several nieces and nephews.
