James Edward Pezzullo, Sr., 73, passed away Thursday, Dec. 17, 2020 at Bellin Hospital in Green Bay, WI.

Jim was born Aug., 5, 1947 in Iron Mountain, son of the late Vincent and Jeanette (Pietrantonio) Pezzullo. After graduating from Iron Mountain High School in 1965 he attended Northern Michigan University. Jim served in the U.S. Army and was a Vietnam War Veteran. He married Carol Grimes on July 15, 1967, in Gladstone, MI. A lifelong resident of the area, Jim started out working at Systems Control in 1976 and eventually helped establish BOSS Snowplow where he took a position as the first project manager. He finished his 40+ year career as a cost accountant at M.J. Electric, retiring this past October. He was an avid pool player and placed as top shooter in the Iron Mountain, Norway and Niagara pool leagues.
