IRON MOUNTAIN - Janice Ann Rosene, 52, of Iron Mountain went on to glory at her home on Sunday, Sept. 19, 2004, after a long and courageous battle. Jan was born on Sept. 24, 1951, in Battle Creek, lower Michigan, to the late William and Verna (Vought) McDonald.

Jan met the love of her life, her husband Barry Rosene, in Albion, lower Michigan. They were married on July 26, 1975, and moved to the Upper Peninsula after Jan graduated from Kellogg Community College with an associate degree in nursing. She was first employed as a surgical floor nurse at Bell Memorial Hospital in Ishpeming.

In 1983, she and Barry moved to Iron Mountain with their two children, where they have been residents ever since. Jan was employed as a registered nurse at Dickinson County Healthcare System in the Intensive Care Unit for 11 years and in the Cardiac Rehab Department for nine years.

Jan had a passion for people and selflessly cared for others in many ways. She continued working until a few weeks before her death because of her dedication to the nursing profession.

An active member of the Michigan Nurses Association, Jan served on the Restructuring Task Force and Economic and General Welfare Cabinet at the state level, where in 2001 she received the Economic and General Welfare Cabinet Achievement Award.

Jan was a current member of the Superior Chapter of the Michigan Nurses

Association, where she served as secretary. Last week, the Superior Chapter named their scholarships the Janice Rosene Scholarships for Nursing.

Jan was chosen as Employee of the Month at Dickinson County Healthcare System and was a Runner-Up Nurse Excellence Award Winner. This past May she was recognized at the Michigan Nurses Association Centennial Gala as one of six Nursing Leaders of Today in the state of Michigan.

An active member of St. Mary Queen of Peace Parish in Kingsford, Jan was a Eucharistic Minister and was a member of the St. Anastasia Craft Circle. Jan enjoyed sewing, baking, traveling, making crafts, spending time with her family and friends and serving others in her own quiet way.

She is survived by her loving husband, Barry; a son, William, 25, of Avondale, Ariz.; a daughter, Katie, 24, of Iron Mountain; three sisters, Nancy (Michael) McDonald Headley of Singapore, Peggy (Harry) Dowling of Cathance Lake, Maine and Cathy Ferrell of Lakeland, Fla.; a stepbrother, Michael Fleming of Battle Creek; two stepsisters, Kathey Davis of Dalton, Ga. and Paula (Tom) Guilfoyle of Ceresco, lower Michigan; a stepfather, Darwin Fleming of Battle Creek; a mother-in-law, Florence Rosene Heuring of Menominee; several aunts and uncles, cousins, nieces and nephews, and many special friends, all of whom she loved dearly.

Jan was preceded in death by her father, William McDonald and her mother, Verna (Vought) McDonald Fleming.

Visitation will be Wednesday from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. at the Erickson-Rochon & Nash Funeral Home.

Funeral services will be held on Thursday at 5:30 p.m. at St. Mary Queen of Peace Catholic Church. Fr. Mike Woempner will offer the Mass of Christian Burial. Burial will be in Cemetery Park in Iron Mountain.
