NIAGARA, Wis. - Jennie Neveau, 83, of Niagara, Wis., died Wednesday, Dec. 29, 2004, 28 years to the day and time of her husband Arnold's death, at the Hyland Nursing Home.

She was born on Jan. 4, 1921, in Negaunee, daughter of the late Zefferino and Rosa (Bertolda) Bertot.

Jennie worked at the C&R Bar, the Kimlark, Doug's Hilltop and Jennies. She owned and operated Neveau's Root Beer Stand with her husband.
