Joyce Manko, 87, of Iron Mountain, died Thurs. May 5, 2011 at Portage Point Nursing Home in Houghton. She was born on Sept. 17, 1923 in Iron Mountain, the daughter of the late Edward and Valera (Weiser) Tousignant.
