June was preceded in death by a son, Timothy Murray; grandson, Pierre Murray; great grandson, Aaron Edberg; in-laws, August and Mary Murray; brother, Donald Cousineau; Sisters, Camilla Troyer, Lorraine Moore, Eileen Nord, and Mayme Parachelli.
