“Attention is the first form of love. Attention is the purest form of love.”

Kevin told me that when we were at the intersection of Blaine and Vulcan, on our way back from Jim's music to pick out an acoustic guitar. He said it often. That -the simple act of giving someone your attention- the time of day, a listening ear- was a great expression of love.

We talked to me often about his daughter Sophia- we carefully picked out a Bible together for him to leave to his daughter "Bird"- the black leatherbound Word on Fire edition of the four Gospels is what we decided on. That was really important to him, that it be just the right one.

When you called to leave a message on his phone, you first had to listen to him perfectly execute Brian May's guitar solo from Bohemian Rhapsody in its entirety. No words. No words needed. Because who else could pull that off!?

He got involved with one of our choirs here, and was able to play a few times with his uncle John Richtig, and Bill Morrison. His playing was always so crisp and polished.

At every Mass, at a certain point- we always pray that we can join in singing with the angels and saints in their unending hymn of praise (the prophet Ezekiel tells us they sing forever): "Holy, holy, holy"- that here on earth, at the Mass- we are not only practicing for heaven, but taking part in the same act of worship alongside those in heaven.

That is our prayer for Kevin today, we pray for the repose of his soul, and that the Lord would give him his place in the heavenly choir.

*In the end he died a holy death- after I have him last rights at his parent's condo the first time I visited- I spoke with Jeannine and Theresa, and when I walked back past his room he was looking up and beaming- joyful. Over the course of the last few years,
-over a thai-chicken pizza at spud's
-by the fountain in the courtyard here between our houses
-or after a guitar lesson at his house,
we had many deep and long conversations about life and death,*

about Catholicism and eternity and theology.

(If any of you are far from the faith or a relationship with God- I hope his journey these last few years causes you to consider- what is it that he saw HERE? This great lover of beauty and truth?)

He spent his last few years- not dying, but living. Very intensely, always a dreamer.

One of the most practical developments in the world to the spread of the Gospel was the Roman network of roads- it allowed for the first postal workers to carry the Gospel and the letters of St. Paul to cities like Corinth, Ephesus, Rome, the region of Galatia, Phillipi, ancient Philadelphia, and all the others. It's fitting that, as I was leaving his room in the ER a couple of Saturdays ago- Kevin said to me in parting, "Go do your thing, spread the word."

Rest in peace Kevin. We love you, and will miss you so much.

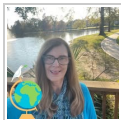
