KINGSFORD - Leno J. St. Juliana, 85, of Kingsford, died Friday, Dec. 31, 2004, peacefully at his home.

He was born on March 9, 1919, in Hermansville, son of the late John and Catherine (Busellato) St. Juliana. He graduated from Hermansville High School in 1937.

Leno married Elizabeth Nault on Sept. 6, 1941, in Spalding. He served with the United States Army Air Force from 1942 to 1945 during World War II and served as a gunnery instructor. He was a resident of Kingsford since 1946. Leno worked for the V.A. Hospital as the warehousing supervisor until his retirement in June of 1979.
