IRON MOUNTAIN - Lloyd C. "Putt" Trepanier, 77, of Upper Pine Creek, Breitung Township, died Sunday, April 6, 2003, at St. Joseph's Hospital in Marshfield, Wis.

He was born April 1, 1926, in Upper Pine Creek, son of the late Joseph and Ellen (Olson) Trepanier. He had been a resident of the area all of his life.

Lloyd married Barbara Norman on Feb. 27, 1965, in Iron Mountain.
