KINGSFORD - Lon D. Carr, 81, of 401 Lyman St., Kingsford, died unexpectedly Monday, Aug. 25, 2003.

He was born Jan. 6, 1922 in Dallas, Wis., the son of the late Roscoe and Hattie (Blake) Carr. He moved to this area with his parents at an early age and has been a resident since that time. He graduated from Kingsford High School in 1940. Lon was an Army veteran, serving in World War II.

He married Adelaide "Babe" Hankey on Aug. 22, 1942 in Chicago. He was the building construction superintendent for the Proksch Construction Company in Iron River for 27 years. He also worked for Dickinson Homes for 10 years after retiring from Proksch. Lon was an avid snowmobiler, hunter and loved spending the summer at camp. He was a member of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church.

He is survived by his wife of 61 years, Babe; his daughter, Lynn (Dale) LaVigne of Kingsford; his son, Lon Carr Jr. of Winter Park, Fla.; two grandchildren, Stacy Black of Apopka, Fla. and Andrea Carroll of Fayetteville, N.C.; three great-grandchildren, Dillion Black, Zane and Sarah Carroll; a sister, Cleo Acker of Silverton, Ore; a brother, Larry Carr of Daggett; many nieces and nephews.
