Louis C. Pucci Jr., 94, of Iron Mountain passed away Thursday, October 15, 2020, at ManorCare Health Services in Kingsford.

Louis was born Oct. 13, 1926, in Iron Mountain, the son of Louis Sr. and Helen (Rocconi) Pucci and graduated from Iron Mountain High School in 1945. During WWII he served two years in the U.S. Navy, and he also attended Ferris Institute, obtaining a drafting degree. On June 21, 1947, Louis married Joan Beauparlant at St. Mary & St. Joseph Catholic Church. A lifelong resident of the area, he worked as a draftsman at Lakeshore Inc. for over 29 years, retiring in 1989. Louis enjoyed golfing and was a member of Pine Grove Country Club and St. Mary & St. Joseph Catholic Church.

Louis is survived by his wife, Joan; two sons, John (Debbie) Pucci and Daniel Pucci, both of Iron Mountain; a daughter, Catherine Norman of Iron Mountain; four grandchildren, Matthew Norman, Erica (Dan) Basilla, Elizabeth (Graham) Bradley and Michael (Amber) Pucci; and eight great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by a daughter, Marianne Pucci in 1966 and a brother, Ted Pucci.
