



Lyle "Chub" Jarvis

June 5, 1927 - April 17, 2010

Lyle Joseph "Chub" Jarvis, 82, of Iron Mountain was called to God on April 17 surrounded by family after a long battle with cancer. He passed away at Oscar G. Johnson Veterans Hospital.

Lyle was born June 5, 1927, in Crystal Falls, to the late William & Delia (Plourde) Jarvis. He graduated from Crystal Falls High School Class of 1945. Lyle served in the Army during WWII. On Feb. 4, 1950, he married the former Alice E. Takala.
