IRON MOUNTAIN - Lyle J. Hinkley, 93, formerly of 1011 Prospect St. in Iron Mountain, passed away on Sunday, Nov. 30, 2008, at Hyland Nursing Home in Iron Mountain.

Lyle was born July 19, 1915, in Iron Mountain, son of the late Austin and Hilda (Rayome) Hinkley. He was a 1933 graduate of Iron Mountain High School and served as a second lieutenant with the United States Army during World War II.

Lyle married the former Mary Elizabeth Goggins on June 3, 1944, at St. Patrick Church in Green Bay, Wis.

As a lifelong resident of Iron Mountain, Lyle was a member of St. Mary and St. Joseph Catholic Church where he has been an altar server since he was seven-years-old. Lyle was also active in the church as a Eucharistic minister, usher and reader. He was also a member of the Knights of Columbus (4th degree) and Holy Name Society.

Lyle enjoyed golfing and was an avid bridge player. He and his wife Mary enjoyed traveling together.

He is survived by two sons, Thomas (Kathleen) Hinkley of Shelby Township,
