KINGSFORD - Manial E. "Turk" Fredenberg, 80, of Kingsford, died Thursday, Dec. 10, 2009, at the Golden Living Center in Florence.

He was born on March 13, 1929, in Flint, Mich., the son of the late George and Bertha (Steinmetz) Fredenberg. Turk served as a corporal in the U.S. Army during World War II in Germany and in Korea during the Korean War.

He married Mary Jane Youngren on Oct. 19, 1962, in Crystal Falls. The couple lived in the Fox Valley for many years, before moving back to this area in 1991. She preceded him in death on June 5, 2009.

Turk worked at CR Meyer Contractors for 28 years. He was a woodworker, carpenter, and millwright. He also enjoyed hunting and fishing. He was a member of American Martyrs Catholic Church and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

He is survived by his son, Randy Fredenberg of Pompano Beach, Fla.; two "adopted granddaughters," Jovanna Jones and Jalena (Joel) Pitz, both of Wausau and Jalena's daughter, Reya Lynn; two brothers, Ralph Fredenberg of Arizona, and Walter (Erma) Fredenberg of Highland, Ind., a sister, Lucille Spowles of New London, Wis.; and many nieces and nephews.

Turk was preceded in death by a sister, Catherine Fredenberg and a brother, Bernard Fredenberg.

Visitation will be Wednesday from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Erickson-Rochon & Nash Funeral Home.

Funeral services will be Wednesday at 1 p.m. at the funeral home. Fr. Joseph Gouin will officiate.

Burial will be in Cemetery Park.
