IRON MOUNTAIN - Marian J. Arnold, 80, of 1303 West A St. in Iron Mountain, died Saturday, April 15, 2006, at Pinecrest Medical Care Facility in Powers. She was born Aug. 7, 1925, in Iron Mountain, daughter of the late Rudolph and Linnea (Jacobson) Johnson. Marian was a lifelong resident and graduated from Iron Mountain High School in 1943.

She received a degree in nursing from the Swedish Covenant Hospital in Chicago. Marian was a registered nurse and had worked at the old General Hospital and the VA Hospital, both in Iron Mountain.

On Dec. 12, 1948, she married Jack Arnold. He preceded her in death on April 26, 1997.

Marian was a member of the First Covenant Church and the NARFE. Her favorite pastime was spending time with her nieces and nephews at Spread Eagle and was fondly known as Auntie Bobo.
